Kitchener, ON – June 16, 2010 – With 26,000 Facebook fans showing their support for talk show host Ellen DeGeneres to come to Kitchener-Waterloo Oktoberfest as the Thanksgiving Day Parade Grand Marshal, local Ellen fans want to know- what else will it take to bring Ellen to Canada's Greatest Bavarian Festival.

A couple of weeks ago, the idea may have seemed like a far-fetched dream for Canadian Ellen DeGeneres fans but thanks to a short appearance on The Ellen Show and a steadily growing Facebook Fan Page, this far-fetched wish has people pulling their lederhosen out of the closet early in support of the campaign.

On Monday, May 10, the Kitchener Waterloo Oktoberfest Thanksgiving Day Parade made a short appearance on The Ellen Show during her "What's Wrong With This Photo" segment. The photo sent in by Sherri Douven from Kingston, Ontario, was taken at last year's Thanksgiving Day Parade and shows the back of a parade float with a rather phallic appearance.

Almost immediately a fanpage appeared on Facebook suggesting the funniest woman in daytime television see the float for herself at the 2010 Parade.

And now, local Ellen fans are ready to do more than just join a Facebook page; they will be taking it to the streets to get their chicken dance on in hopes of getting Ellen's attention to bring her to this year's Thanksgiving Day Parade.

On Thursday, June 24, all Ellen fans are invited to join a mass chicken dance taking place in front of Kitchener City Hall on King Street. The public is encouraged to wear their Oktoberfest gear, make signs to encourage Ellen to come and definitely bring their cameras.

- Who:** Some of the special guests include: Carlos and Adele from 91.5 The Beat, Onkel Hans, The Monkey Vault Stunt Team, Neil Aitchison, Mike Fischer on the accordion, local Bavarian Dance Groups, the now famous Lion's Club Lion Float and the new Beaver float.
