- 4. The winning name will be debuted at the Thanksgiving Day Parade and announced on our Kitchener-Waterloo social media channels.

Check out the <u>Willkommen Platz</u> (located at 44 Gaukel Street) between October 5 – October 8 and sample the various food and beverage items including turkey legs, Oktoberfest-themed poutines and pizzas, schnitzel, featured cocktails and a large selection of beer.
